Contraindications for the Prostate MRI

If any of the following apply to you, you may not be a candidate for the prostate MRI exam, part of the exam may not be able to be performed, or the quality of your data may be compromised.

- 1. Prostate Biopsy (within 8 weeks) and any continued post biopsy bleeding
- 2. Rectal bleeding
- 3. Anal fissures
- 4. Rectal surgery (end to end anastomosis)
- 5. Inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis/Crohn's disease).
- 6. Hip replacement
- 7. Some types of penile implants (*patient must check with doctor)
- 8. Vascular clips (brain)
- 9. Vascular clips (other than brain-OK, after six months
- 10. Known anaphylactic reaction to latex compounds
- 11. Anti-coagulant drugs
- 12. Severe claustrophobia
- 13. Cardiac pacemaker
- 14. Metal in eye (previous or current)
- 15. Any other metallic or foreign object in body. Please check with us or your physician prior to your appointment.
